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Application for surface water extraction licence

Application for surface water extraction licence S71B Water Act (NT)

The Controller of Water Resources hereby gives notice that a decision will be made under section 45 of the *Water Act*, regarding an application for the grant of a surface water extraction licence.

The application relates to Portion 1644 town of Pirlangimpi and is for a total of 395 ML/yr. The proposed beneficial use is for Public Water Supply.

The source of extraction will be the Blue Water Creek. No other extraction from this resource is currently licensed and the total volume that is currently taken is zero (0)ML.

The Tiwi Islands Water Study indicates a discharge flow rate for Blue Water Creek of approx 3,700 ML per year. Estimated sustainable yield (20 per cent of discharge) equates to approx 740 ML/yr.
