Tigers claim 17th premiership on Tiwi Islands

The Imalu Tigers continued their Tiwi Islands Football League premiership dominance with a 45-point grand final victory over the Ranku Eagles in Nguuu yesterday. The Eagles got the better start but the Tigers ran away 13.10 (88) to 6.7 (43) winners.

It was Imalu's 16th flag and second in three seasons after losing to the Tapalinga Superstars last year. The win was set up by a ram-paging Alex Puruntatameri, who was awarded the Brother Pyle Medal as best on ground, and four goals by Albert Tipungwuti.

Imalu coach Kevin Pangiraminni was proud of his troops, who turned around a 16-point semi-final loss to Ranku two weeks ago.

The Eagles had the jump early through two superb goals from Tiwi Bomber Roy Kantilla in the first term, his second from a spectacular pack mark 35m from goal. The Tigers hit back to take the lead at half-time and asserted their dominance in the third, opening up a 28-point lead at the last change.

Graham "Aeroplane" Puruntatameri (two goals) was prominent in the last with a classy set shot goal, and also helped set up David Kantilla for another major. The Eagles only managed one goal after half-time when Jacob Puautjimi snapped truly in the third.

Michael Dunn, Phillip Babui and Wayne Tipungwuti battled hard for Ranku, who failed to add to their only TIFL premiership in 2001.
