It has been a big year for Tiwi Islands



In the last twelve months, TITEB has successfully placed 73 participants into employment. All of these placements have been with locally based organisations. The main employers have been Tiwi Enterprises, TIRC, NUA, Outback Stores, MCPS, Northern Rise, BIHA, McMahons Construction, Gibson Mining and TITEB itself. All of these employers have placed multiple participants into work, embracing the spirit of RJCP in employing and empowering local people. There are many other local business also embracing RJCP in providing Work experience to our participants, both paid and unpaid.

RJCP provides a grassroots alternative to employment services with the ultimate goal of sustainable jobs and community based activities that ultimately lead to better, stronger communities. As the service provider, TITEB has embraced this.

TITEB has employed 15 people in the last year from our caseload, 8 of these were graduates of the Skills for Education and Employment (SEE) program, a language, literacy and numeracy program also run by TITEB. TITEB has employed local talent across the board in all of the services that we deliver, including but not limited to RJCP, SEE, Money Management and the Remote Schools Attendance Strategy (RSAS). TITEB is firmly committed to having 80% Tiwi employed within the company by the end of 2015 and has a clear succession plan to ensure

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
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

Xavier Catholic College Wurrumiyanga



Xavier Catholic College Wurrumiyanga provides a Quality Catholic Tiwi Education for students from Year Seven to Year Thirteen.

This year, Xavier Catholic College Wurrumiyanga (XCCW) and the whole school community is celebrating a monumental occasion. At the end of 2014, two students – Jericka Mungatopi and Amber Tipiloura – will be receiving the Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET). Both students completed their studies while schooling on the Tiwi Islands and have attended both Murrupurtiyanuwu Catholic Primary School (MCPS) and XCCW to complete their 13 years of education.

These girls are leaders and role models for future generations of Tiwi students. They have shown that Tiwi students don't need to leave home to complete their senior secondary studies, but can stay in community and graduate successfully.

The girls have had a challenging year, coming to school every day and working hard with their teachers to complete all their work and assignments. Their teachers - Russell Smith, Rebekah Sibenaler, Michael Joseph and Tahnee Gale - have worked extremely hard alongside these girls to support them throughout this journey.

On Friday 21st of November, the girls, their families and friends, members of the Catholic Education Office as well as their teachers from XCCW and MCPS went in to Darwin for the NTOEC Graduation Dinner and Presentation Evening. The event was held at SkyCity Casino and the night was a wonderful reward for all the girls' hard work. Dressed in their finest, our students were presented with a Stage 2 certificate of completion. Jericka and Amber also received an award for the 2014 NTOEC Top Achiever for their Stage 2 Health, Recreation and the Community subject and they celebrated into the night with other NTOEC Graduates from across the Territory.

Thank you to everyone in the community who helped support these students in the completion of their studies.
