Apprentice Management

TITEB offers management services to Tiwi employers, including handling the paperwork, travel and training arrangements for their apprentices. Our aim is to make taking on Tiwi apprentices as easy as possible for the employer and the apprentice to ensure that more Tiwi get qualified and competent in their chosen trade.



Last year, the CDU Automotive Team were very supportive of our Tiwi apprentices, Caine Bower and Samson Puruntatameri who are doing mechanics apprenticeships. Both men gained Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) for prior work experience.

With his children all at school, Sampson is able to commit to his apprenticeship which requires frequent trips to Darwin. He is incredibly grateful for the support of his partner Dorothea and children who are very proud of their Dad.

Caine has already shown us what a great mentor and inspiration he can be. We hope that when Caine completes his trade qualification he will support and supervise other aspiring Tiwi mechanics.

We would also like to congratulate Wayne Tipungwuti and Wilfred Pilakui who commenced their apprenticeships with BIHA in November 2019. We look forward to supporting them throughout their apprenticeships and helping more Tiwi people to become qualified tradesmen.

Women's Centre CDP Activities

The Women's Centre at Wurrumiyanga has had a transformation and now has a well-equipped kitchen. The women have been learning to prepare healthy and delicious food on a budget whilst gaining skills and confidence to prepare for employment.

They have also been producing some amazing tie dye clothing. Some other highlights included hosting Women's Health week and the Rise Up program. Our supervisors Evita Puruntatameri and Sophia Tipuamantumirri also presented at the Australian Evaluation Society conference.

In Pirlangimpi, the Women's Centre continues to produce amazing products from printed fabrics, utilizing the skills gained from a Visual Arts course. The range is always expanding and their Darwin Aboriginal Art Fair stall did them proud. The women have also hosted two very successful open days, which will be a regular occurrence this year.









Men's CDP Activities

Men at all sites have been busy cleaning and mowing yards, doing community cleanups, assisting community prepare for ceremonies and using their new skills gained from the large variety of training provided.

Milikapiti has rebuilt its Hydroponics after a fire caused significant damage. The range of produce continues to increase as the job seekers experiment with different plants. We are looking forward to seeing what produce we can provide the community with this year.

Last year, Senior Supervisor Bill Doolan joined the team at Wurrumiyanga Farm. The men have been working hard to prepare for the exciting changes happening in 2020. We will be increasing our egg production and cultivating a range of new plants.







20th Anniversary Celebrations

The 20th Anniversary was held at Wurrumiyanga Community, Bathurst Island on 10th October 2019. We

hosted some VIPs from TITEB past and present including Norm Buchan, Liz Crosby, Bill Knights and Board Members, as well as Lawrence Costa, Marion Scrymgourand CEOs from stakeholder organizations.

The day started with a smoking ceremony followed by speeches, traditional dancing, a delicious lunch and of course a gigantic cake. We also had a live band who played for the afternoon. Everyone had a great time dancing and catching up with family and friends. There were a number of speeches. TITEB's ex CEO Norm Buchan spoke about TITEB early days in 1998 and the extraordinary community effort it took to establish the Group Training Organization, Registered Training Organization, training facilities and accommodation.

We also heard from our Chairman Leslie Tungatalum, CEO Maria Harvey and Pirrawayingi Puruntatameri who was the first TITEB Chair and active board member until 2019. Pirrawayingi has made an extraordinary contribution to TITEB over the last 20 years.











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Coxswain Training

TITEB hosted the highly anticipated Coxswain training on both islands, first on Melville Island in July- August then onto Bathurst Island in August-September. All stakeholders were involved including TIRC, the Land Council and Tiwi Enterprises.

Much of the course was conducted in the port, including one day spent on board two tug boats learning about their fire safety systems and vessel structures. The inter-island barge was used as part of the training as well as the swimming pool, much to the delight of the participants. CTB supplied crew members and technical management to ensure each student gained the maximum value from the experience.

The aim of this project is to give Tiwis the opportunity to gain employment in the marine industry. Two candidates have already found employment as a result and we hope further opportunities will arise in the near future.



Tiwi College and TITEB Partner to Employ School Based Trainees

Since 2015, TITEB, Tiwi
College and SEDA have been
working together to help
Tiwi College students
undertake School Based
traineeships. The program
allows the young men and
women to develop work
skills to help them in their
transition from school to
working life.

For the boys, we combine the Certificate II in Sport and Recreation with the school's studies which keep young men interested in school. The trainees also get paid for running coaching clinics for primary school students. We also have two young women undertaking the Certificate II in Business as School Based Trainees. Our trainer, Debra Marshall visits the College throughout the year to deliver face to face training.

Congrultions and well done to all students who completed traineeships or finished school this year.

Both the Tiwi College community and the Tiwi Islands community are proud of their achievements.

The purpose of evaluating the program was to ensure that the program made a difference to the lives of the ladies that participated. Sophia and Evita were involved in the program not only as participants but also as evaluators to provide a different layer of leadership skills.

Sophia and Evita also presented a gift to some of the Indigenous delegates from the Australian Evaluation Society and did TITEB proud. They were very popular amongst the many Australian and international visitors that attended the conference.
